
Literacy Criteria and Rate in Pkistan:



Pakistan literacy rate from 1952 to 2014


According to the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO), Pakistan at 55% has one of the lowest literacy rates in the world, and stands 160th among world nations. 

5. Impact of literacy rate on Pakistan,s GDP


Literacy rates have a significant impact on Pakistan's gross domestic product (GDP). Public expenditure on education amounts to 2% of the GDP. The government of

Pakistan approved a new national policy in 2009,

according to which education expenditure will be increased to 7% of the GDP. During the past 37 years, the highest public expenditure on education was 2.80% of the GDP in 1987–88. Public expenditure on education as a percentage of the GDP actually decreased over 16 years and was maintained in the five years between 1972 and 1973 and 2008 and 2009. Since 1972, 37 years ago, public expenditure on education as a proportion of the GDP has decreased. Pakistan may have reached 4% of its GDP well before 2015. However, it is unlikely to happen as consumption levels remain significantly unpredictable and unstable.

Islamic Education:

Being an Islamic country our education system must abide by Islamic system and values. But, unfortunately we have only one or two course books of Islam that are read and taught only to secure good marks and to make percentages. Islam should be taught on practical basis not regarding theory. There must be a regular basis lectures on logical learning of Islam and benefits of following it in life.

Pakistan textile industry, historically a significant contributor to the country's exports, has


experienced a notable decline in growth in recent

<u>Aafia Siddiqui?</u>

Siddiqui, a US-educated-Pakistani national, was charged with attempting to kill US soldiers and FBI agents during interrogation after her arrest in 2008 in Afghanistan's Ghazni province. She was flown to the US and sentenced to 86 years in prison after a New York court found the 49-yearold mother of three guilty of attempted murder and assault in 2010.

Siddiqui earned her undergraduate degree from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT) in 1995 and a doctorate in neurosciences from Brandeis University in Boston before moving back to Pakistan in 2003.

According to her family, Siddiqui and her three children were abducted by the Pakistani intelligence agencies immediately after her return.

In 2008, she appeared in Afghanistan and was detained by the Afghan police, under suspicion of planning a suicide bomb attack and being in possession of notes on how to make chemical weapons and dirty bombs, accusations denied by the family and lawyers. She has been imprisoned in America for no reason

Author and anti-war activist Sarah Flounders has followed Siddiqui's case for more than a decade and believes she is innocent.

"She is a victim of secret rendition. I attended her court trial. It was just a show trial and a theatre of war on terror," Flounders told Al Jazeera over the telephone.

"The US government should immediately free her and reunite her with her children."

Activist Sarah Flounders addressed the protesters demanded the release of Aafia Siddiqui

The protesters also accused the prison officials of treating Siddiqui inhumanely. In July, she was attacked by a fellow inmate with a mug of hot liquid and later locked in solitary confinement.


"It resulted in burns around her eyes and could have damaged them permanently. There were visible bruises on her arm," Siddiqui's lawyer Marwa Elbially told Al Jazeera.
