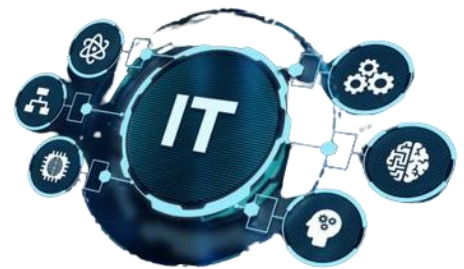
IMPROVEMENT OF PAKISTAN'S JUDICIAL SYSTEM:
